TO ALL MEMBERS:

Dear Friends,

Despite the difficulties involved in setting up a new Fellowship, we are satisfied with the results obtained so far. Our greatest satisfaction is that, in merely three years, we have been able to pinpoint some operative criteria which have gained the appreciation of the "Friends of Magna Graecia". This encourages us to persevere in and increase our commitment. However, we ask for our members' collaboration on the following matters, and, confident of their assistance, we thank them for this:

1. The Officers - Old and New

Our regulations state that officers are renewed every three years. Nominations for the following offices should therefore be sent to the Secretary Franco Clemente (Fax +81 764 5552) by 30th November 1996:

 a) offices vacant because of expiry of mandate: Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Regional Co-ordinator for Germany; b) newly-created offices: Regional Officers for the Netherlands, Belgium-Luxembourg, Spain-Portugal, Great Britain, Scandinavia, South America, North America and Oceania.

The officers in this second group (b) are essential for spreading the news about our Fellowship which has been launched with few members. And we invite these few members to collaborate to this end.

2. Fellowships and Marketing - How to get Rotarians Involved

The imminent nomination of our new officers will give us new energy to extend our Fellowship. Under their guidance, all non-Italian members should be involved in a vital *development campaign*, because their contribution is the decisive one. Non-Italian members are asked to photocopy at least page 4 of this news-letter and distribute it among their Rotarian friends.

We ask all who join the International Fellowship of Magna Graecia to form area groups when possible. As well as facilitating our organisational work, these groups

could foster other International Service activities (such as various types of exchange, Contact Clubs etc.). This is a field that has hitherto been neglected in southern Italy, but such activities are now possible, given the interest for International Service our tour-meetings have aroused. Similar initiatives could offer our Fellowship development campaign new opportunities, especially if their meetings coincided with ours: they would be an excellent introduction to our activities.

3. Tour-Meetings - Organisational Criteria

The itineraries of our standard tours in Magna Graecia (see page 4) should be studied carefully, with attention to detail, to satisfy various requirements. Large towns should be avoided, so that participants can discover new places in pleasanter environments. In this way, participants will visit places hitherto neglected, not because deemed unimportant - far from it - but because unprofitable for commercial tour-operators.

Divided into small groups so that they can get to know one another better, participants should visit the best to be seen in the area, including museums and monuments closed to the general public, accompanied by the best guides or, when possible, by famous experts. This has already happened!

Itineraries should be carefully and competently chosen every time by the Organising Committees, specially formed for this purpose by the "Friends of Magna Graecia" in the individual regions of southern Italy. Local members will then welcome guests, act as guides when they visit their area and invite them to a meeting with their Rotary Club so that they

can get to know one another. Thus we can offer the best of Rotary: to foster international goodwill and do so at a very personal "get-involved" level!

An organisation of this kind can not be improvised: it requires a certain experience and even if it were perfect, it would be cold if the participants were not enthusiastic. What counts in the end is their attitude: their desire to have a holiday and make new friends. The secret of the success of our trips lies with you!

With these operational criteria, we will propose tours which allow participants not only to spend precious leisure-time in a different geographical location but to discover something new, make comparisons with their own country and, above all, meet new friends with whom to share a holiday. The uniqueness of our tour-meetings lies in their underlying philosophy: travelling is great, but travelling with old and new friends is something extra that makes a trip an unforgettable experience and transforms it into an adventure for the spirit!

And so take up this year's invitation: Magna Graecia awaits you with its history, its monuments, its people, its colours and its flavours which are so different from your own. Find time to leave your world and get to know another world which will welcome you warmly. You will go back home a different person, enriched and improved, and you will have performed a Rotarian service while enjoying yourselves immensely.

STOP-OVER IN SOUTHERN ITALY: 19th - 25th June 1997

BRIEF PRESENTATION OF IFMG FOR WOULD-BE MEMBERS

The Magna Graecia International Fellowship (IFMG) aims to bring together Rotarians keen on history, heritage and archaeology who are particularly interested in southern Italy: Magna Graecia.

Members of the Fellowship will receive detailed documentation (both printed matter and videotapes) on the history, art, natural environment and ethnic and social aspects of various sites of Magna Graecia.

A cultural tour with a different chosen theme will be promoted every year with local Rotarians as guides. The tour must have a specific theme because of the complexity of the historical sites in a region which for several millenia has been the crossroad of exchanges between North and South, East and West. Every site reveals traces of the great civilisations which have followed on, one after another, for almost 3,000 years, very often in areas of outstanding beauty.

Nowadays history and nature together in this part of Italy form something which is unique in the western world. A journey to these shores has always been regarded as a return to the classical world and a return to nature, with the Mediterranean sun, the sea, lush vegetation and mouth-watering produce.

These considerations justify the Magna Graecia Project, which offers Rotarians cultural tourism for the élite.

The tour, promoted, prepared and guided by Rotarian friends with a common interest in Magna Graecia, could become an annual event in the international Rotary calendar.

1997 PROGRAMME

SPRING TOUR: 25th May - 1st June 1997

"The Murgia Hills and the Gargano Peninsula"

The first part of this new itinerary consists of an interesting tour of the Murgia: a large limestone mass levelled by the sea in prehistoric times and eroded by rain over thousands of years. It has been continuously inhabited since paleolithic times, and the dolmens (we shall visit one of them) and menhirs that still exist are evidence of this. A peculiar rock-civilisation developed in the many caves used for shelter scattered along the ridges of the Murgia's deep gorges. The caves were used as troglodyte dwellings and, in the Middle Ages, as monastic cells and small churches with Byzantine frescoes, one of the gems of Italian art. We shall also visit the Sassi: an architectural system hollowed out of the rock on the steep side of the Matera Gorge.

This long, deeply-felt relationship with the environment gave rise to that Civilisation of Stone which has left us the Apulian Romanesque architecture (visited in our 1995 Tour) and the sophisticated Baroque architecture of Lecce (the subject of one of our future tours).

In order to make the itinerary more varied, we have included a weekend amongst Nature, as we did in our 1996 Tour. We have chosen the Gargano peninsula: a limestone spur jutting out into the sea. Picturesque bays and luxuriant woodlands create very beautiful, everchanging panoramas in an unpolluted environment.
